The current administr ation's efforts to change the narrative without compromising national securit y are indeed noteworthy. The Ministry of Justice will be hap py to collaborate with NILA to develop our laws in this field. By working toget her, we can create a more comprehensive and effective immigration system that benefits all stakeholders.

Once again, I thank NILA for this invitation and commend you for your unway ering dedication to improving immigration law and policy in Nigeria. I look for ward to continuing our collaboration and working together to address the complex immigration challenges facing our country.
